The R/V Tiburon is a 63-foot United States Coast Guard certified passenger vessel designed for research and exploration. She is equipped with stateof-the-art safety gear, electronic equipment, and air/nitrox compressors. Her homeport is Key West, located within the Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary. She is designed to sleep 14 guests and 4 crew in air-conditioned comfort; each intimate cabin is equipped with TV and vanity, 300 thread count sheets and tempur-pedic mattress pads. Two bathroom/showers are shared along with the common areas that include salon, entertainment center, galley and outside deck areas. She carries with her a small fleet of kayaks, expedition tender, snorkel gear, dive tanks and weights.

MONDAY, DECEMBER 27

Check in at Safe Harbor Marina, Key West, Florida at 5 PM. Refreshments and appetizers served from 5 PM to 6 PM. Orientation and safety briefing followed by 8PM departure. Travel overnight to shark location 75 miles out.

TUESDAY, WEDNESDAY, THURSDAY

Rendezvous with a commercial shrimp-fishing vessel. See first hand the process of bringing shrimp from the ocean to the market. Encounter the wild, untamed sharks that aggregate to feed off the shrimpers by-catch. It's not uncommon to see adult lemons, Caribbean reef, great hammerhead, sandbar, bull shark, tiger and nurse sharks. Great numbers of turtles, Goliath grouper and pelagic fish are also attracted to the feeding event.

FRIDAY, NEW YEAR'S EVE

Return to Key West. Watch the fireworks from the deck of the boat, or take the tender in to shore for Key West's famous New Year's Eve festivities.

NEW YEAR'S DAY

Stay onboard and watch football or depart Key West. Those unable to depart on January 1 can stay onboard until the morning of the 2nd.
