Strap into the legendary plane known as "the pilot maker". The North American T-6 was used to train generations of fighter pilots. Known by some as the Harvard or SNJ, the plane is waiting to give you a lesson in aerobatic flight. No pilot's license is required.

The North American T-6 once served in more than 55 air forces around the world. Designed primarily for use as a trainer, the T-6 was also used in battle. It served in World War II, Korea and Vietnam. Some may know the plane by one of its other names. It's sometimes called the SNJ, Harvard, Mosquito or T-Bird. The Texan also saw action in dozens of brush-fire wars around the Congo, Biafra, the Middle East, and throughout Latin America.

You must be in reasonably good health and weigh no more than 250 lbs. Other physical requirements may apply. No pilot's license is required.

Do I actually get to fly the T-6? Yes! Regardless of your experience, once airborne you will be doing the flying. Remember. The T-6 was designed as a trainer. An experienced flight instructor will be in the back seat with a full set of controls. He will handle the taxiing, take-off and landing but you get to do the rest with some coaching from your instructor

What if I'm a pilot? If you're a pilot, you can log your time in the T-6 in your logbook. If you're interested in complete flight training in the T-6, let us know.

What is the cost to fly? An incredible adventure which includes an hour of aerobatic instruction in the T-6, plus photos is \$815. Shorter flights, and multi-flight training packages are available. Contact Incredible Adventures for details.

THE P-40 WARHAWK IS AVAILABLE FOR FLIGHT TRAINING & AIR SHOW APPEARANCES



The P-40 is a World War II legend made famous by the First American Volunteer Group, better known as the "Flying Tigers", who took to the sky in shark-faced fighters. American pilots flew the P-40 against the Japanese at Pearl Harbor.

Although our P-40 primarily served as a training aircraft, "American Dream" is a true war hero, with two confirmed "kills" and one unconfirmed "kill".

The single-engine P-40 Warhawk made its debut in 1939 and was one of the premier aircraft flown by Allied Forces in World War II. Some know the P-40 as the "Tomahawk" or "Kittyhawk".

When are training flights available? Flights are available on select dates, Monday-Saturday, and must be scheduled in advance.

What does it cost to train in the P-40 Warhawk? Pricing depends on flight duration and starts at \$990 for a 15-minute introductory flight. A one hour flight retails for \$2850 US. All prices include necessary ground school.





Our dual-cockpit, dual-control Curtis TP-40 N is one of only five such aircraft still in existence. Only about 40 of the two-seat trainer versions of the P-40 were manufactured.

Will I get to take the controls? Yes! Schedule an introductory or advanced flight lesson and you'll receive the appropriate ground school followed by hands-on instruction in the air.

Are there any special training requirements? You must be in reasonably good health and meet basic height and weight requirements, including weighing less than 250 lbs. Additional requirements apply if you wish to become certified to pilot the P-40.

FLORIDA WARBIRDS GENERAL INFORMATION

Where in Florida are P-40 and T-6 flights available? Flights are offered in partnership with a vintage flight school located at Kissimmee Gateway Airport in Kissimmee, Florida.

Where is Kissimmee? Kissimmee is a town of about 60,000 people located near Orlando. Kissimmee Airport (KISM) is just 8 miles from Walt Disney World.

How do you say "Kissimmee"? K-SIM-EE

What should I wear for my flight training adventure? Dress in comfortable casual clothes. Please wear sturdy soled, closed toe shoes. No sandals or flip flops are permitted for safety reasons. Tennis shoes would be fine. A shirt with a collar will be more comfortable so the harness straps do not rub on your neck. Make sure you have a pair of sunglasses with you also.

Is flying a warbird dangerous? Yes. Our partners at Warbird Adventures operate flights according to strict FAA safety standards, but flying in ex-military aircraft is inherently dangerous. You will be required to sign a Release of Liability and assume all risks.

What else should I know? Your flight training program includes admission to the Kissimmee Air Museum located at the airfield.
